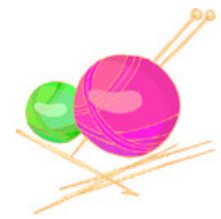




2008 Tuesday Program Schedule

January 8 **Felted Snowman Bag Knit-along**

February 12 **Intarsia**

Got puckers? Or holes? Tacky floats that show on the right side? Jill Van Houten will give us some tips and tricks to avoid these common problems when creating designs that require areas of different colors.

March 11 **Double knitting – Snowflake Headband Knit-along**

This cool double-knitting technique allows a knitter to create a warm, over-the-ears headband that's one color with a contrasting design on one side, and the exact opposite colors and design on the other. Great to make in school colors, team colors, or to match a favorite winter outfit.

April 8 **Preemie Hats & Booties**

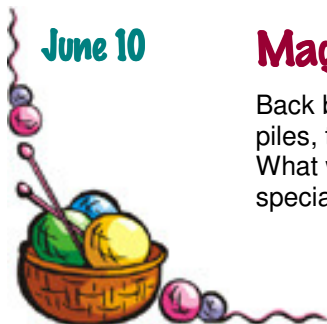
Size does matter! Susan Hammarlund will lead us in a charity knitting project for the tiniest of babies. We'll share yarn tips and patterns that are good for practicing many techniques. These are quick projects that use small amounts of yarn, but do a great deal of good in the world.

May 6 **Illusion Knitting**

Here's another great knitting knowledge technique. Illusion knitting: now you see it, now you don't! Amaze your friends and families with this tricky design – just don't give away the secret—unless you want to hook another knitter.☺

June 10 **Magic Ball**

Back by popular demand! Bring your yarn odds and ends to toss into the color-coordinated piles, then choose your favorite colors and start winding your own one-of-a-kind ball of yarn. What will you make with your Magic Ball? A scarf? A bag? A hat? Will it be a gift – or something special for yourself?

Fair Isle Christmas Ornaments Knit-along

Christmas in July? Well, yes. We'll take advantage of the Sailing Knitter's visit to Sacramento to teach us how to create her unique 3-dimensional fair isle ornament patterns. Make them in different colorways and you'll have a beautiful hanging ornament for many occasions.

August 12

Felted Pumpkin Bag Knit-along

It's still a bit too early to bring out our snowmen bags, so here's a felted project we can start using almost right away: a cheerful pumpkin bag or basket! Will yours be a Fall pumpkin – or a Halloween jack-o'lantern?

September 9

Doily Afghan Knit-along

What do you get when you make a doily using big needles and yarn? A quick and beautiful lacy afghan! We'll go over the pattern and cast on together, then continue to monitor our progress on-line. Since doilies only have a limited number of rows, these projects move right along. (Gift idea???)

October 7

Lace Christmas Ornaments

Another head-start project! This time we'll make lacy baubles to hang from a tree, decorate a package, trim a wreath, or give as a gift. Quick to knit in big lacy stitches, you'll want to make more than one!

November 11

Brickwork Hat

We'll finish our creative year with a last-minute gift for that hard-to-please person on your list. This hat, from our own Sailing Knitter Terry, uses scrap yarns and an easy slip-stitch pattern to create a unique and fun-to-do project.
